TUCSON, ARIZONA: Robert (Bob) Davin Phillips, 46, a proud father and husband who served as a project manager with K & S Construction/Tucson Rental Homes, died April 8 at his home in Tucson, Arizona after a thirteen month struggle with glioblastoma multiform brain tumor.

Bob grew up in Tallahassee, Florida where he attended Maclay School. He then attended Washington and Lee University where he was a member of Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity. After graduating from W&L, Bob worked briefly for a United States Senator. Upon becoming a CPA, he then pursued a twenty year career in law firm management while residing in Alexandria, Virginia. He was an active alumni member of his college fraternity and founding member of their 23 year tradition: "The EP Invitational". Bob also enjoyed a family and golfing membership at Belle Haven Country Club in Alexandria.

In 2006, Bob and his family moved to Tucson, Arizona. He participated in the development of a 96-unit luxury apartment complex on the far, east side of Tucson. He was inspired, motivated and thoroughly enjoyed his work.

Bob is survived by his wife Amy L. Phillips, an association executive with the American Academy of Physician Assistants, their son Jack and three golden retrievers.
