4 lives claimed on roadways

Jeanette Marie Bragg was partially ejected from her Nissan sedan and killed Feb. 3 when her vehicle flipped into the median on U.S. 81/287 just south of Decatur. She was traveling with her 15-year-old son north on U.S. 81/287. Bragg's vehicle veered onto the shoulder on the east side of the highway, overcorrected and crashed into the median. Her vehicle rolled several times.

Primitivo "Primo" Sierra, 65, owner of Primo's Taqueria in Decatur, died Feb. 4 at a Denton hospital after suffering injuries in a wreck earlier that afternoon. He was a passenger in a car driven by his wife, Margarita, 63, involved in a two-vehicle accident just after 3 p.m. at the intersection of U.S. 380 and Business 380 on the east side of town near the Shell gas station. The Sierras were westbound on U.S. 380 in a 2007 Honda Element when they took the crossover to Business 380, pulling out in front of an eastbound Dodge pickup truck driven by Jeramie Warren, 47, of Crandall. The two vehicles collided, causing serious injuries to Mr. Sierra. He was taken by Wise County EMS ground ambulance to Medical City Denton.

Winogene Mayfield, 81, died Feb. 5 at John Peter Smith Hospital in Fort Worth from injuries sustained in a two-vehicle accident on Farm Road 730 Jan. 18.

Haley Brumley, 22, of Alvord was killed Feb. 9 in a one-vehicle accident on Farm Road 51 south of Springtown in Parker County. Brumley was traveling northbound on FM 51 in a 2005 Dodge Ram truck shortly after 10 p.m. Near Veal Station, she lost control of the vehicle and entered a side skid. The truck overturned multiple times. Brumley was partially ejected.
