He was so proud when Ace became a professional bullfighter, and he and Corrie traveled all over to watch him dance with the bulls.

Mitt was a member of the Bad Company Rodeo Company and lived by their motto of Expect The Unexpected. This tribe was his family, too. He loved music of all kinds and to read endlessly. Mitt treasured taking Corrie to their favorite place, Taos, N.M., and giving her yellow roses every chance he could. He was known as a thinker of great thoughts and his accomplishments in his life show this to be true. He was a beloved husband, father, brother, son-in-law, uncle and friend to many who will miss him dearly. He was a bright light and loved to make others laugh in this old world.
