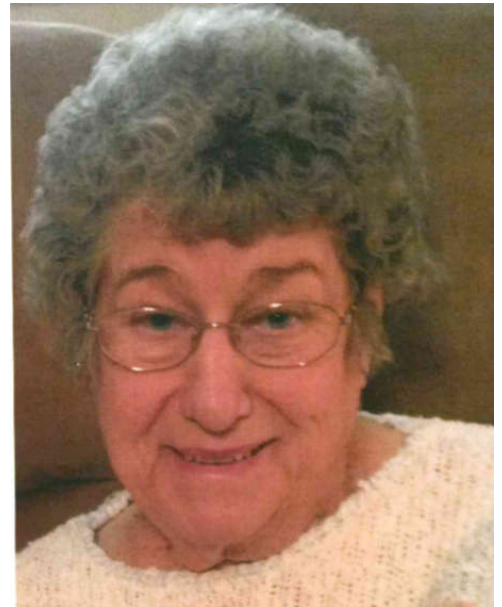




Landers, Mary L. 'Lou'
