Charlie loved playing basketball and was well liked by his classmates at Forestburg High School. He attended North Central Texas College followed by proudly serving in the U.S. Navy on the U.S.S. Worden DLG.

Ever the heart of a servant, he graduated valedictorian from North Central Regional Police Academy in 1975. He was a police officer in Decatur and Denton for six years. Charlie stated, "I didn't
