Helen "Pink" Louise (Mauldin) McCarty passed away peacefully Saturday, Nov. 5, 2022, at her home. She was 99.

Graveside services were held Wednesday, Nov. 9, at Aurora Cemetery. Rev. Jimmy Withers of Aurora Baptist Church officiated. She was born to John "Jack" Henry Mauldin and Elma Blanche "Daisy" Allum Mauldin on July 31, 1923, in Fort Worth. She was the youngest of five Mauldin sisters from Arlington Heights, Fort Worth. She was baptized at a young age by the Rev. J. Frank Norris of the First Baptist Church of Fort Worth. She graduated from Arlington Heights High School in 1940.

During World War II, Helen worked in the Consolidated Vultee (Lockheed Martin) parts department that produced B-24 bombers in Fort Worth.

On Dec. 16, 1950, she married Oliver W. McCarty. They had two daughters. In 1963, the family moved to Aurora, a place Helen called home for the rest of her life. Helen was an excellent cook and was known for her coconut cream pie. She was a faithful member of Aurora Baptist Church.

Helen was preceded in death by her parents; husband of 43 years; sisters, Dorothy Nail, Geraldine McElroy, Ruth Ashmore and Margie Griner; and several nieces and nephews.
